Anesthesia: Local Anesthesia Moderate Sedation by RN Monitored Anesthesia Care

Pre-Operative Medication Orders (prior to day of scheduled procedure)

- If insulin dependent, take ½ dose of long acting insulin (such as NPH, Lantus, etc.) per regular schedule the night before procedure. Hold all diabetic medication the morning of procedure.
- May take blood pressure meds per regular schedule with sip of water on day of procedure.

Physician Orders

- NPO after midnight
- Obtain consent for above noted procedure(s) and anesthesia
- Labs: CBC, BMP if not obtained within 30 days. If Creatinine Clearance < 60 on prior labs, repeat BMP day of procedure. INR/PT/PTT day of procedure if on warfarin/novel oral anticoagulants such as Apixaban, Dabigatran, and Xarelto.
- Urine pregnancy test for women with menses to post-menopause
- 12 lead EKG morning of procedure
- IV, 20 G or larger, preferred site is Left forearm
- Bolus normal saline 500ml over 1 hour then normal saline at 150 ml/hr X 6 hours then TKVO
Call MD prior to initiating bolus if have concerns of heart failure signs and symptoms
- Procedure prep and clip: Bilateral Femoral Right Arm Left Arm
- Void on call to procedure

Medications

- Do not hold Aspirin, Plavix, (Clopidogril), Brilinta (Tricagrelor), or Effient (Plasugrel)
- Aspirin Chewtab 162mg, chew once, even if patient took aspirin at any time prior to arrival
- Ativan 1mg IV pre procedure when called to cath lab (0.5mg if > 75 years old)
- Benadryl 25 mg IV pre procedure when called to cath lab
- Warfarin Don't hold Hold – Date of last dose _____
- Novel Oral Anticoagulants (NOAC such as Apixaban, Dabigatran, and Xarelto):
